

LESSON

Objectives

By the end of this lesson, children will be able to:


Identify how second-hand & third-hand smoke is harmful

Share and talk about second-hand & third-hand smoke with their family and friends

Promote a tobacco-free lifestyle among their family and friends

LESSON PLAN

Show and read the story out loud to the class.



After the story:

Encourage children to convey the message to their family members who smoke: "We need fresh air, please don't smoke!"

Remind children to be polite when encouraging the people around them to quit smoking.

Ask children what they have learnt from the story.

Have your students answer the following questions:

- Where is The Anti-Smoking Squad going? (*The Jungle Festival*)
- Who do they meet along the way? (*Puffin' Porcupine*)
- What is he doing? (*Smoking*)
- What do they teach Puffin'? (*The harmful effects of second-hand & third-hand smoke*)

LESSON PLAN

End the segment with a song:

Let's Say No Everybody



Information for teachers to note:

Second-hand smoke:

- Causes serious cardiovascular and respiratory diseases, heart diseases and lung cancer.
- Higher chance of irritation of the eyes and nose.
- Increased susceptibility to coughs, wheezing and asthma.
- Children who have never had asthma before are more likely to develop it if either parent smokes.

Third-hand smoke:

- Young children and infants are especially susceptible to toxins from cigarette smoke as they crawl on, play on, touch and inhale particles from contaminated surfaces, like sofas, carpets, and floors.

(Sing to the tune of "Polly Put the Kettle On")



Smoking makes our

LESSON



Objectives

By the end of this lesson, children will be able to:

Identify and understand the meaning of the 'No Smoking' signs that are found in the neighbourhood

Understand the harmful effects of cigarette litter on the environment

LESSON PLAN

Introduce the 'No Smoking' sign to the class.



Show this 'No Smoking' sign to the class and ask the following questions:

- Have you seen this sign before?
- Where can you spot this sign?
- What does this sign mean?

Show and read 'Keeping the Environment Smoke-free!' out loud to the class.



LESSON PLAN

After the story:

Have your students answer the following questions:

- What was the Anti-Smoking Squad doing in the forest? (Putting up a 'No Smoking' sign)
- What does that sign mean? (The sign prohibits anyone from smoking in that area)
- How does smoking harm the environment? (Cigarette butts are mostly made of plastic and take years to decompose. Also, partially stubbed cigarettes pose a fire risk.)
- What was Puffin's idea? (To make the entire forest a 'No-smoking' area by putting up more signs)



End the segment with an activity:

I Spy With My Little Eye



Explain Worksheet 1 to the class and bring them out for a walk to locate the 'No Smoking' signs around the neighbourhood.


